Satisfy us, O God.**

As we gather at this table, we remember these words of our brother Jesus:  
"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I  
will give you rest.

**We come to this table weary and burdened.  
Give us rest, O God.**

The risen Lord Jesus is with us!

**Let us open our hearts to God and to one another. Amen.**

We take joy in this meal which we share together, and remember that Jesus too is here, with us. In our midst are bread and wine to remind us of his promises to us:

*Bread*, for he is the bread of life and he nourishes us as we put our trust in him.

*A cup*, a reminder of his sufferings. He took up the cup with his friends before he was crucified and his blood flowed.

He suffers still with those who weep, or sigh today and with those in pain or distress. As we eat and drink we remember Jesus who lived and died and rose again for us, and was present with his followers when bread was broken.

(pause)

Come, Holy Spirit, come!

**Bless this bread, and bless this fruit of the vine.**

Bless all of us in our eating and drinking now.

**May our eyes be opened, that we may recognise the risen Christ in our midst, in each other, and in all for whom Jesus died.**
